# MADRID, SPAIN

Madrid is the largest Jewish community in Spain, made up of several warm, welcoming communities. Despite several barriers to entry, students connecting through KAHAL have access to a Progressive (reform), Masorti (Conservative), and Orthodox community—all of whom provide programs for young adults. #### SHABBAT AND HOLIDAYS

Comunidad Judía de Madrid (CJM): A traditional community that holds Shabbat and Holiday services in Hebrew and Spanish. They organize weekly Friday night dinners for students and young professionals that draw an international mix of people.

Communidad Judia Reformista de Madrid: A Progressive (Reform) community that holds Shabbat services and potluck community dinners twice a month, as well as services and dinners on all the major Jewish Holidays. It's a small, relatively new community that sometimes organizes volunteer and social events as well.

Home Hospitality: There are many families that love hosting study abroad students in their home for Shabbat and Holiday meals. Contact KAHAL staff to be set up with a local family.

Marom España: A group of students and young professionals that organize social and cultural events, as well as Shabbat and Holiday dinners and services. They are affiliated with the Masorti (Conservative) movement, but are open and welcoming to Jews of all background. Their events are publicized in a private, secret Facebook group. Ask KAHAL staff to be added!

DIY Experience: KAHAL micro-grants are available to any Jewish student studying abroad to help facilitate your Jewish experience. Grants can be used to host your own Shabbat or Holiday meal, organize an event, attend a seminar or conference, or in some cases, as travel subsidies. Grants will be made in USD up to \$250.
