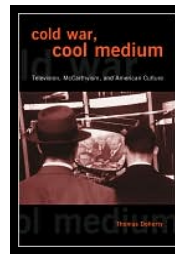
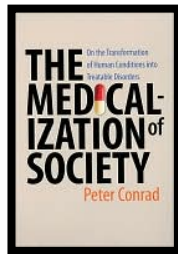
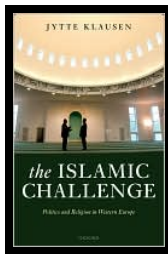




**Brandeis Osher Lifelong Learning Institute
2009 Winter 'Brandeis Author' Series**



All Programs meet on Wednesdays 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.

In this series of programs, Brandeis authors will discuss their books which BOLLI members will have read in advance of the meeting. The Brandeis authors will introduce their books and focus on content and context that led to their writing the book.

Why did s/he write the book? Has s/he continued scholarship on this topic? How has it evolved?

Sessions will feature facilitated discussion between the author and BOLLI participants and provide an opportunity for members to learn from the expertise and scholarship of the Brandeis faculty.

January 14, 2009 *The Islamic Challenge: Politics and Religion in Western Europe*, Jytte Klausen, Ph.D., Professor of Comparative Politics. The author interviewed three hundred Muslim political and civic leaders in six West European countries. She describes leaders' visions for the integration of Islam into the politics and policy in their countries. (264 pages)

January 28, 2009 *The Medicalization of Society: On the Transformation of Human Conditions into Treatable Disorders*, Peter Conrad, Ph.D., Harry Coplans Professor of Social Sciences. This book builds on three decades of research to explore the forces behind the trend to treat what were once considered normal human conditions as medical ailments, e.g. social anxiety, male menopause, erectile dysfunction and sexual orientation. The author examines changes in medicalization and its consequences for health and society. (224 pages)

February 11, 2009 *Cold War, Cool Medium: Television, McCarthyism, and American Culture*, Thomas Doherty, Ph.D., Professor of American Studies. The thesis of the book is that, contrary to conventional wisdom, America became a more open and tolerant place through the influence of television. This unique book is the first to examine the subject through the lens of television programming. (320 pages)
