

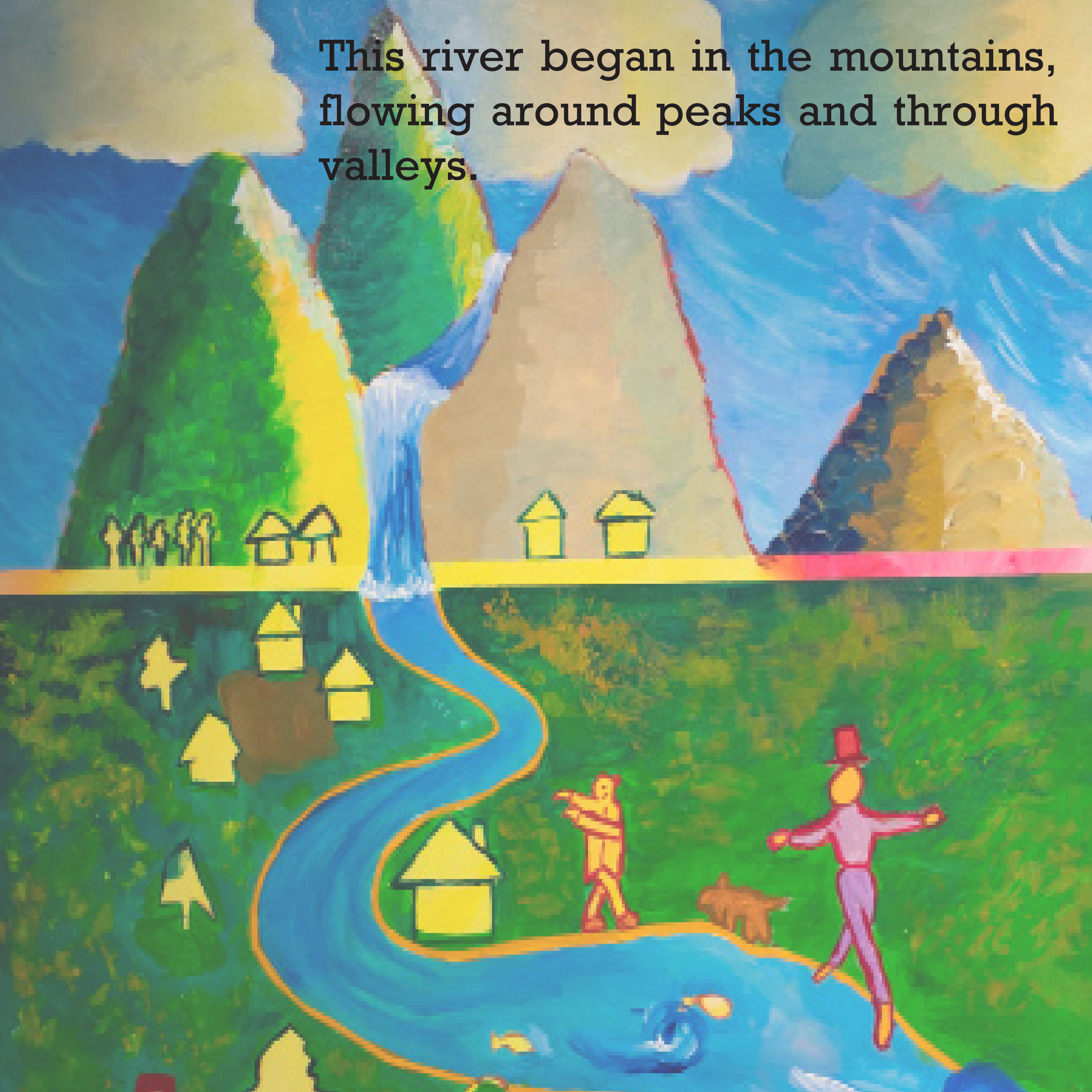
Waters Breathe, too: an Anthology

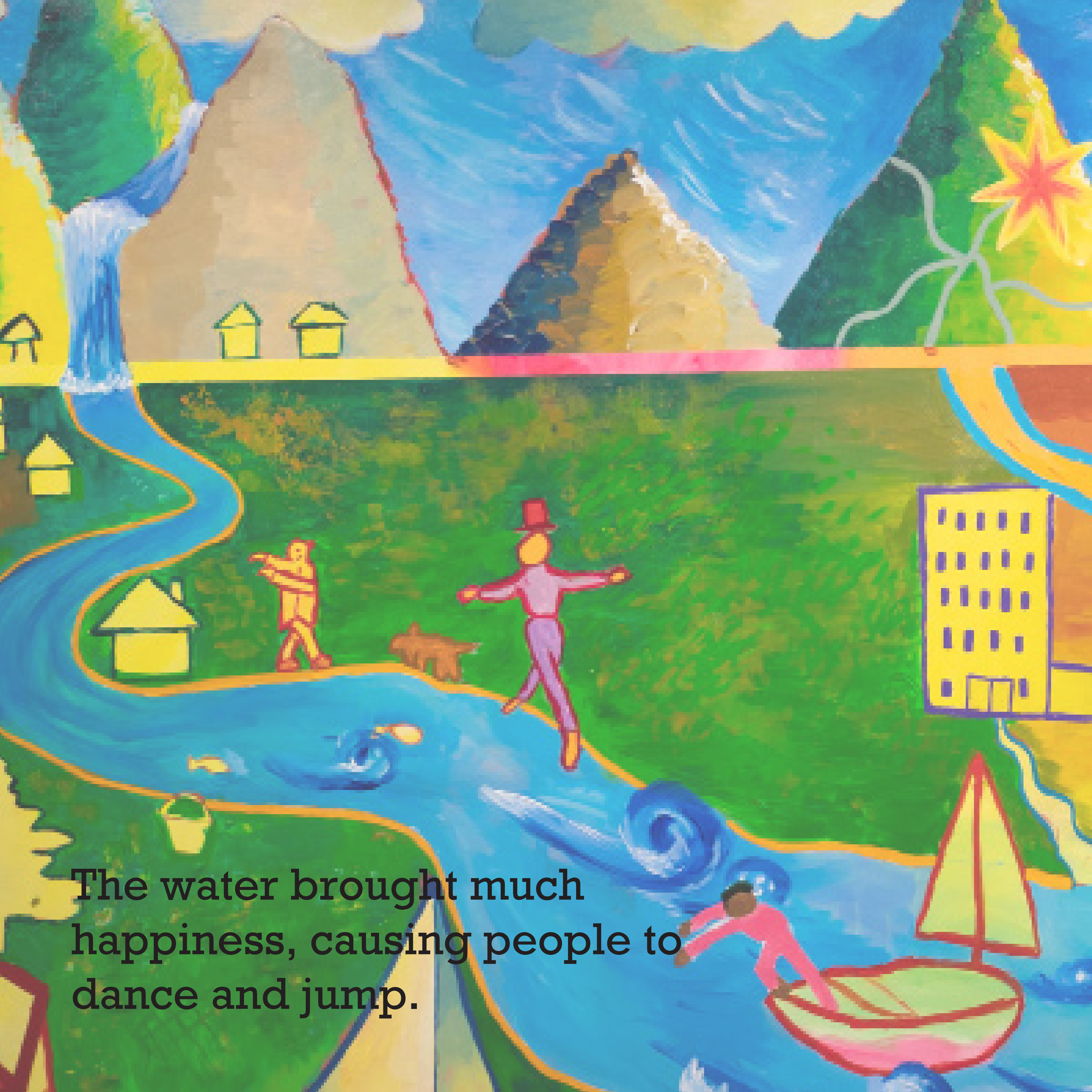


Once upon a time there

valleys.



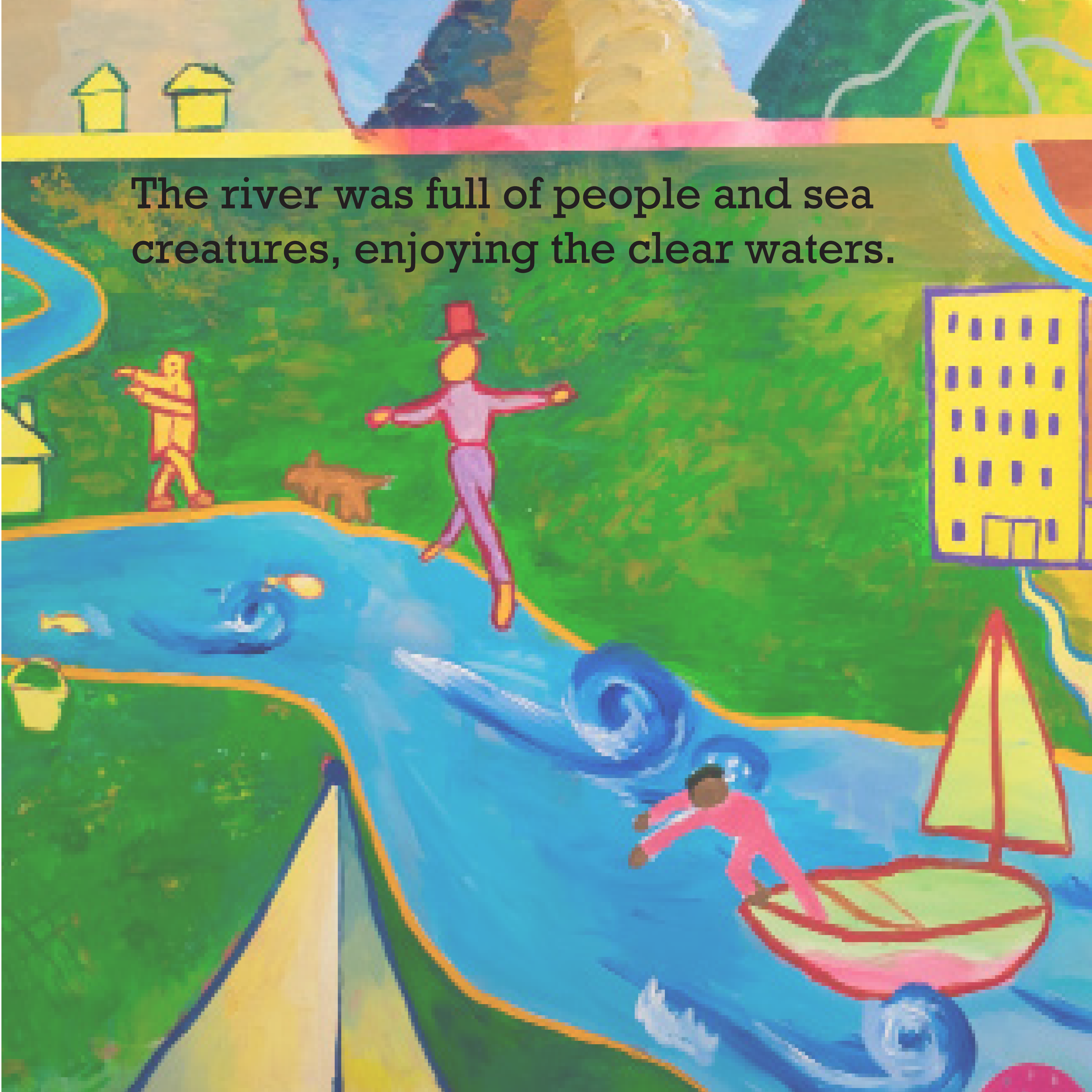


The water brought much happiness, causing people to dance and jump.

Ships were built to travel up and down the river.



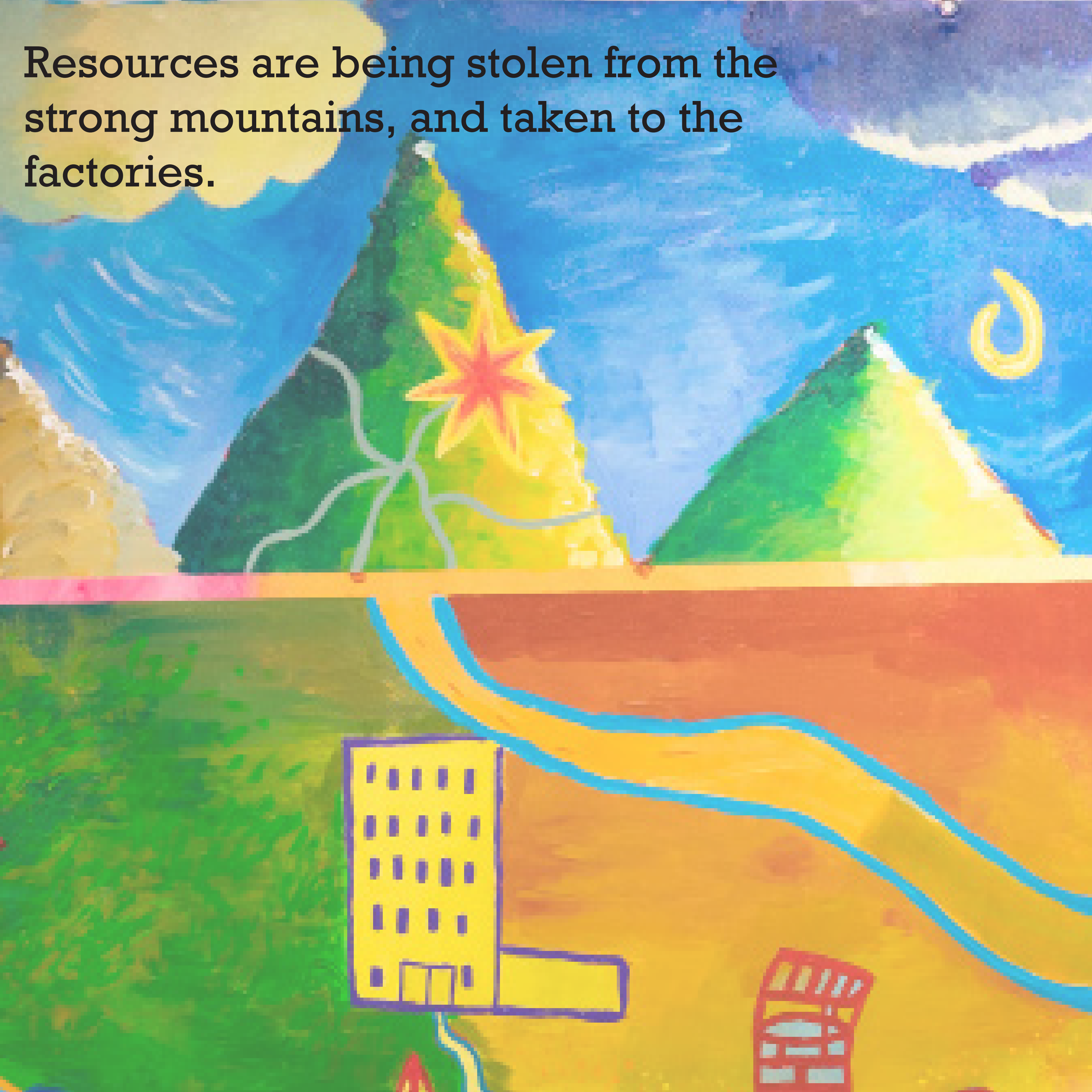
The river was full of people and sea creatures, enjoying the clear waters.

Resources are being stolen from the strong mountains, and taken to the factories.



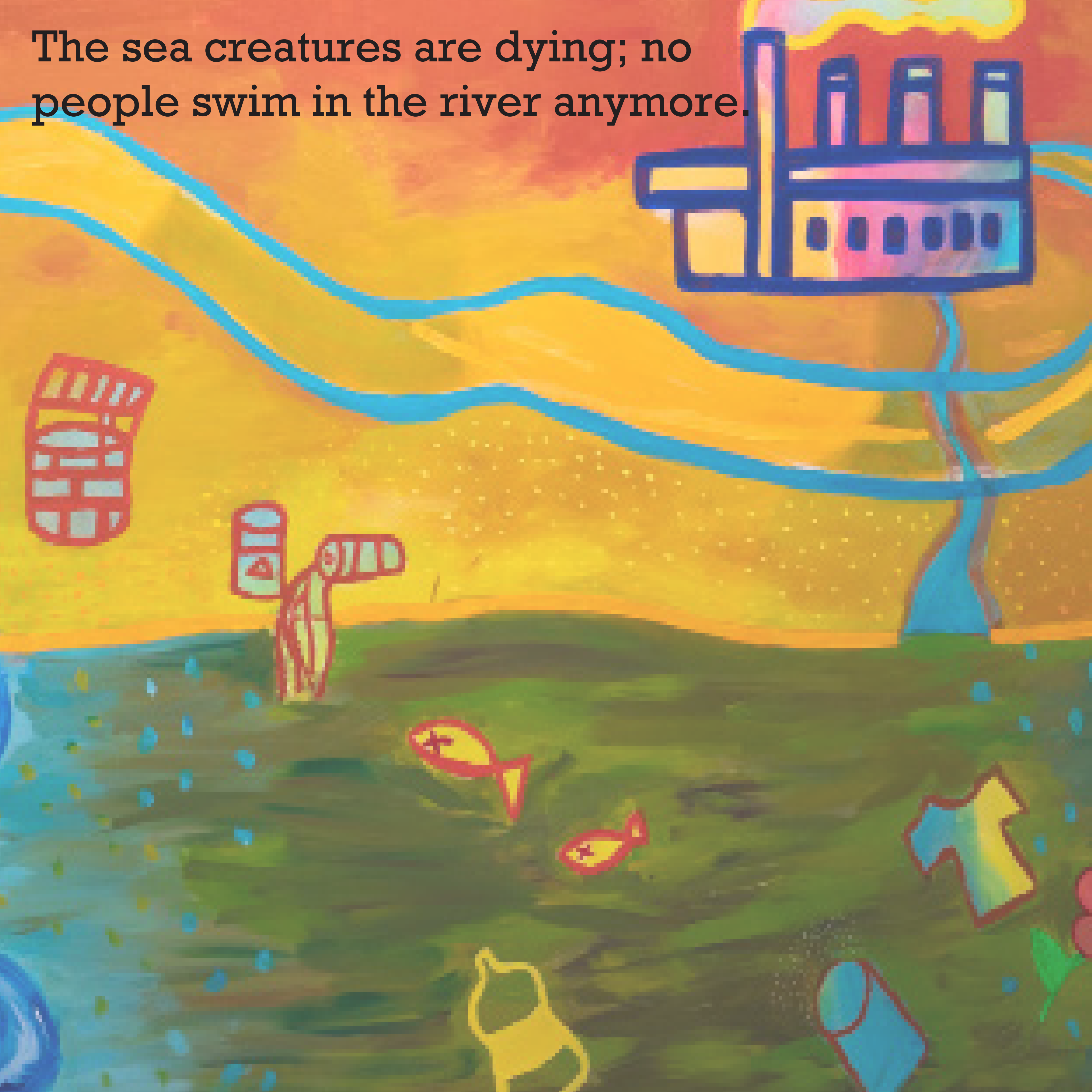
The factories are dumping pollution into the rivers, causing the clear water to turn brown.

hurricanes destroy entire cities.



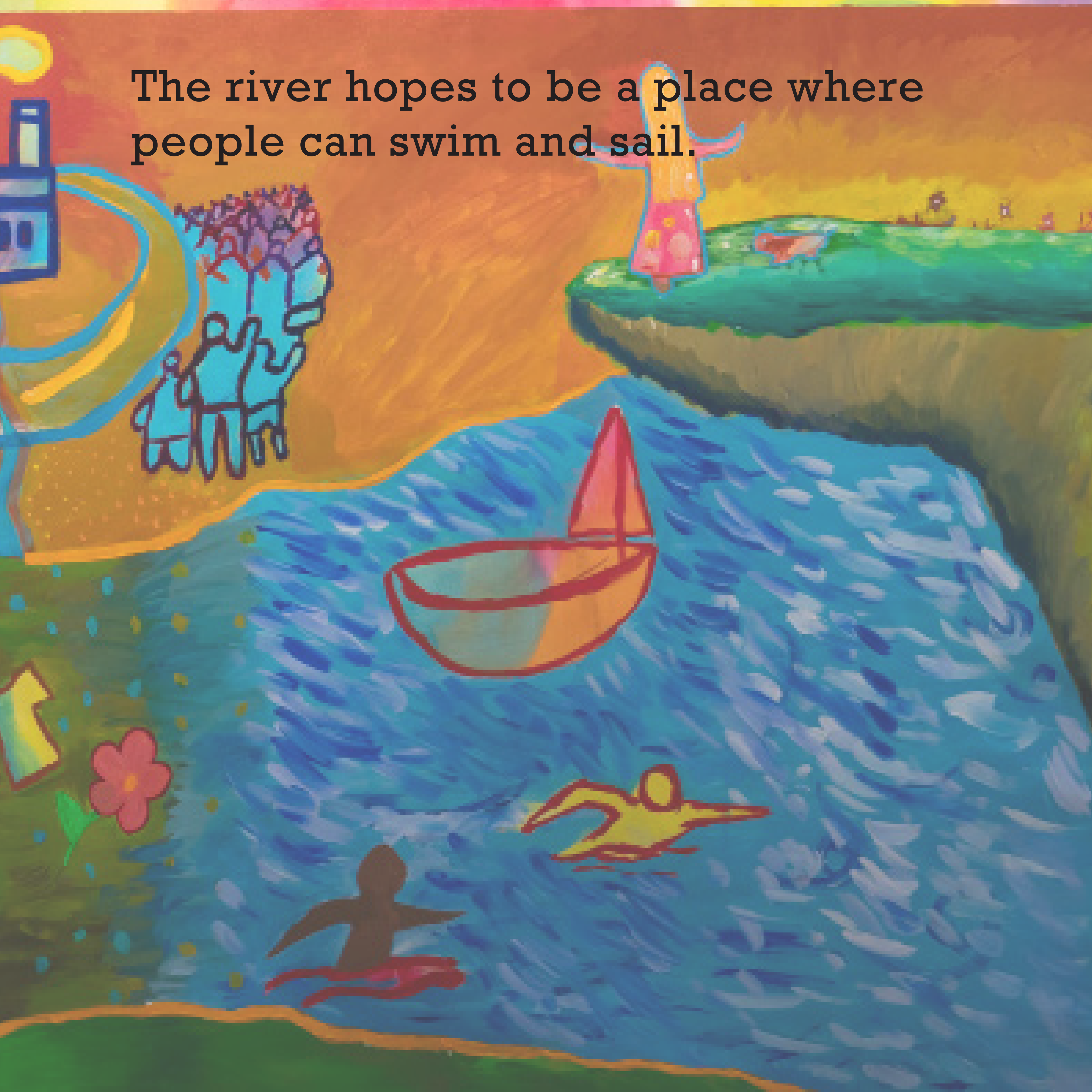
The lands are dry and aching from the memories of the river.





The river wants to be clear again.

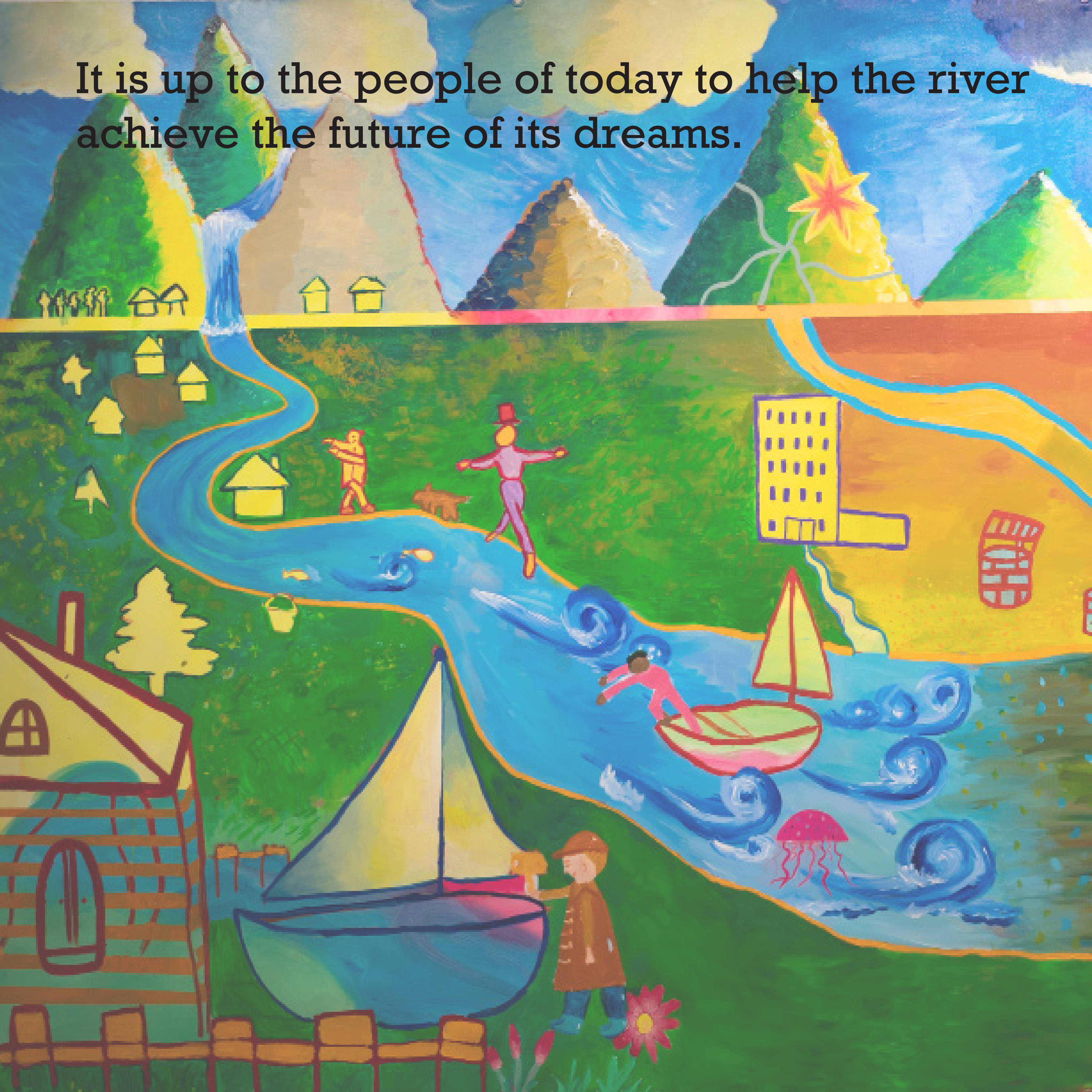
The river hopes to be a place where people can swim and sail.
