

Theodore A. Johnson is a professor in the [Slifka Program in Intercommunal Coexistence](#) and co-directs the Dual Masters Program in Conflict and Coexistence and Sustainable International Development with the Heller School. He has worked in post-apartheid South Africa, with Greek and Turkish Cypriots towards bi-communal capacity building, and with universities and political leaders in Northern and South Central Iraq to develop joint problem-solving skills and strategies. He has served as an advisor to several UN Agencies such as WHO, FAO, UNCTAD, and the international food safety organization Codex Alimentarius. He has published articles on International Mediation and Alternative Dispute Resolution. His research areas include Cross Culture- Cultural Communication and International Organizations. Prior to his international work, Dr. Johnson was a Deputy District Attorney in Orange County California and is a member of the California and American Bar Associations.
