A Word About Exemptions

If you think you can be exempted from a particular class based on previous coursework, please see your program advisor during orientation. Do not un-enroll from a required class until you have met with your advisor. Exemption requests for any and all degree requirements are to be submitted during the first semester.

Course Registration

You are undoubtedly beginning to think about which courses you will be taking in your first semester, and what you may need to know about registering for courses. To make it easier for incoming students, you are all pre-registered in several of the program requirements.

BA/MA students are not preregistered due to their need to coordinate their graduate classes with their undergraduate requirements. BA/MA students can contact Meredith Robitaille (mrobitai@brandeis.edu) with questions about registration.

If you are in the **MA** or **MBA** programs, you will be pre-registered in the following course requirements:

ECON 201a - Global Economic Environment

ECON 207f- Applied Microeconomics (if needed)

ECON 210f- Foundations of Statistics (if needed)

FIN 201a- Investments

FIN 212a- Accounting & Financial Analysis

If you already have a background in **Financial Theory** or **Accounting**, you will be enrolled in their more advance equivalent.

Additionally, **MBAs** will be pre-registered in the following:

BUS 252a- Marketing Management

BUS 228f- Management Communication

If you are in the **MSF** program, you will be pre-registered in the following required courses:

ECON 201a - Global Economic Environment

ECON 210f- Foundations of Statistics

FIN 201a- Investments

FIN 202a - International Corporate Finance

FIN 212a- Accounting & Financial Analysis

Students interested in purchasing textbooks ahead of time can go to the [Brandeis Bookstore](#) online to determine which books are required for which courses. Please note that returning students often wait until the fall to post notices about selling their used books. You will learn more about this during orientation.

Health Insurance Requirements

Since the following are required by law, and not the University, Brandeis doesn't have the authority to "exempt" someone from the law. A student must take the University health insurance unless s/he has comparable coverage. A "comparable plan" MUST include:

- 1) The policy MUST be purchased through a U.S.-based company or U.S.-based subsidiary.
- 2) The plan MUST go beyond emergency care and include:
 - a. Diagnostic and medical services
 - b. Coverage for pre-existing conditions
 - c. Pregnancy coverage
 - d. Some level of prescription drug subsidy
 - e. At least \$100,000 coverage per illness/injury
 - f. Emergency medical transportation
 - g. Maximum deductible of \$250

A student is required by law to either:

- 1) attest that her/his coverage meets these legal standards -- or--
- 2) sign up for the University coverage.

Meet Your Leadership Fellows

One of the ways in which new students are welcomed to the IBS Community is through our Leadership Fellows program. Sixteen specially selected second year students are designated as Leadership Fellows. It is their responsibility to reach out and connect with a small group of incoming students and assist them with their academic,

cultural and social adjustment throughout the year.

Over the next few weeks, you will hear from your Leadership Fellow and your group (randomly selected) will consist of about 14-16 other first year students who come from a variety of different countries and backgrounds. They are here to answer your questions about almost anything from which neighborhood to live in, to which finance course to sign up for. And if they don't know the answer, they will know to whom to refer you so that you can get the right answer. You'll be hearing a lot more about them and from them in coming weeks.
