### **Adjunct Faculty Pool**

The Brandeis International Business School invites applications for its adjunct faculty pool. Depending on the School's teaching requirements at any given time, some individuals in the pool are asked to teach courses on a part-time basis, usually in evenings. Main areas of teaching involve business, economics and finance, with emphasis on international issues and quantitative tools.

Adjunct faculty members are typically distinguished practitioners with concurrent professional careers. In most cases, they also have successful teaching experience. In the past, they have taught courses such as "Legal Environment of Business", "Information Systems", "Transnational Negotiations", "International Portfolio Management" and "Consulting Approaches." Compensation is competitive with salaries for similar positions in other leading universities.

IBS (formerly the Graduate School of International Economics and Finance) is a rapidly growing, niche business school focused on global markets. The school enrolls more than 300 graduate students from 54 countries in MBA, MA, MSF and Ph.D. programs.
