IBS Computer Cluster

The IBS Cluster holds 38 Dell 755 computers, 1 public printing and 1 public copying system. The Dell 755s are Dual Core processor machines with 4 gigs of ram and CD burners to help suite your file saving needs. These computers are set up for Student and Faculty use and have a number of programs for use including:

- Microsoft Office 2007
- Adobe Acrobat 9
- Adobe Photoshop Elements
- MATLAB and many other statistical software

Remember, the IBS Cluster computers are refreshed every 3 weeks. Anything installed or saved on these computers will be removed and lost every time they are refreshed. It is highly recommended, not to install or save any files to these systems. Students should save their files to external sources such as flash drives or portable hard drives. Brandeis International Business School Bloomberg Lab

IBS is home to the Brandeis University Bloomberg Terminal Lab. This lab is located on the bottom level of Lemberg Academic Center by the rear entrance. This lab contains 11 Bloomberg Terminal Computers (10 and 1 for instructor purposes). Each computer has a dual monitor configuration and contains Bloomberg, Microsoft Office, Endnote, and Excel/Endnote Bloomberg Plugins. The Bloomberg Lab is for use of Members of the Brandeis University Community and is often used by Faculty in their coursework and classroom learning. IBS World Court

The World Court in Lemberg houses 3 iMac computers for the Mac users of IBS. These computers have Dual Core processors, 2 gigs of ram, cd burners and basic software for use by IBS Students and Faculty. Microsoft Office 2008 and Adobe Acrobat are available on these computers for your Mac file editing needs. Although these computers do have internet access, they do not have general network access. This means that they are not attached to any printers and the general Brandeis Network is not accessible through these systems. To log on, choose the IBS username provided; and remember, do not save files to these systems as everyone has access to the same user account.

IBS Asper Center

The Asper Center also contains 3 PCs and 3 Cubicle Work Spaces. These PCs and Cubicle Work Spaces are for use of IBS Student Workers and IBS Sanctioned Users only, and are not to be used by the general Brandeis Community or IBS Students.

Each IBS Classroom has Dell 755 computers installed for general faculty use. Students are restricted from using these computers unless directed by a faculty member or the IBS Technology Office. As with the Cluster and World Court Computers, these systems are also refreshed. Saving files or applications on these systems is not advised.
