

## **Master of Science in the Management of Projects and Programs**

### **Current Core/Elective Requirements – Prior to July 22, 2010**

The Master of Science in the Management of Projects and Programs involves the completion of six required courses and four electives. RPJM 101 should be taken first and can be taken concurrently with RMGT 110, RCOM 102, RPJM 113, RPJM 114, or RPJM 118. RPJM 103 must be taken no later than two semesters after RPJM 101. Please note that both RCOM 102 and RMGT 110 may be taken. Only one of these courses may be used to satisfy core requirements and the other may satisfy an elective.
