

HBI Undergraduate and Graduate Student Prize *for Outstanding Research on Jews and Gender*

The HBI announces the fourth annual prize recognizing the creative and significant work carried out by Brandeis students in the field of Jewish gender studies. The HBI Prize will be awarded to one undergraduate and one graduate student for an exceptional research paper written in the current (2011/2012) academic year that exemplifies the HBI's mission of producing fresh ideas about Jews and gender.

The winners of the prize will each receive a cash award of \$250.

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS: TUESDAY, APRIL 17, 2012

Criteria

- Research in all disciplines including arts, humanities, sciences and social sciences is eligible.
- Papers should be approximately 25 pages long, including an abstract and a bibliography.
- The paper can be a chapter or section of a larger work such as an honors thesis, master's thesis or doctoral dissertation.
- Art projects must include a written narrative.
- Papers will be judged for creativity, contribution to the subject, excellence of writing, and integration of gender studies with Jewish studies.

Eligibility

Students must be currently enrolled in Brandeis University.
The submitted work must have been completed in the current academic year.

Application Process
