### Morton Keller

Morton Keller is the Spector Professor of History Emeritus at Brandeis University. Among his books are *Regulating a New Economy: Public Policy and Economic Change in Early Twentieth Century America* and *Regulating a New Society: Public Policy and Social Change in Early Twentieth Century America*. His latest book, *America's Three Regimes: A New Political History*, will appear next fall.

### Melvin I. Urofsky

Melvin I. Urofsky is a professor of law and public policy at the L. Douglas Wilder School of Government and Public Affairs and professor of history emeritus at Virginia Commonwealth University. A leading scholar of the life and career of Justice Louis D. Brandeis, he is the author of *Louis D. Brandeis and the Progressive Tradition* and coeditor of the seven-volume *Letters of Louis D. Brandeis*. He has also written on American Zionism and Israel and is currently at work on a biography of Louis Brandeis.

### Jeffrey Rosen

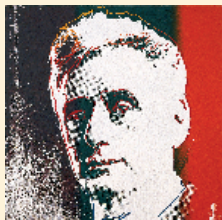
