

The Legacy of Wisdom Project Mission

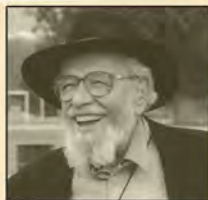

History

In 1992, the principals of the current Legacy of Wisdom Project team developed the Conscious Aging Conference and Seminar series that successfully produced national conferences and professional seminars focused on issues of aging. Collaborators on those events included, American Society on Aging, Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, National Council on Aging, Brookdale Center at Hunter College, Beth Israel Hospital, NYC, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and Elderhostel.

In 2010, our team reconvened as the Legacy of Wisdom Project. The first annual conference was conducted in New York City (April, 2011) and there is a growing library of videos (80+) on our website.

In 2012, we are launching a series of new events including Legacy of Wisdom conferences at Brandeis University in Waltham, MA and Naropa University in Boulder, CO. New workshops are being offered in Basel, Switzerland. Plans for additional events in 2013 and beyond are currently being worked on. We hope you can attend with us in the future.
