SUBJECT: THE ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE OF THE HARLAN CHAPEL.

Dear President Sachar:

I am sure that one of the many things occupying your mind at the present time is the question of an administrative structure for the office of the Protestant Chaplain. I would like to make the following recommendations:

- 1.) That the office be directly related to the office of the President. Since, however, you could not be expected to take care of the details in full, I would suggest that the budget and other administrative details be handled by one of the assistants to the President or by a person such as Dean Zion who might act as a lisison with your office. I think that it is necessary that it be made perfactly clear that the chaplain has access to you at all times and that he is completely free to determine the way in which all budget monies should be spent, and that no funds designated for the office be allocated for other purposes without his consent or that of the advisory committee for the Protestant Chapel.
- 2.) I would recommend the establishment of a five member advisory committee for the Protestant Chapel. This committee's membership could be composed of one representative from the Brandeis administration, one from the Brandeis faculty, and three individuals integrally related to the Protestant Churches. I would hope that these men might be knowledgeable concerning student religious activities on several university campuses. I do not believe that it would be necessary for them to be members of the University staff or faculty, although this should not be a barrier to membership on the committee provided that these three individuals have a substantial relationship to some Protestant denomination. The function of this committee would be the selection of a chaplain and the handling of other personnel matters related to the staffing of the Protestant operation, the advising and consulting with the chaplain concerning the program, and the maintenance of a relationship between the office of the chaplain and Protestant denominations.
- 3.) I would hope that some structure could be devised whereby the Protestant Chaplain and/or the advisory committee could be related to the corresponding structure for the Jewish and Catholic Chapels.

I would strongly urge the adoption of these three recommendations because I think that they would provide a mechanism for the protection of the University and the President from any unwise action in which the chaplain might engage. Secondly, they would provide the chaplain with a mechanism through which he might be guaranteed full freedom of action and at the same time receive

advice and council from individuals who are well aware of the consequences which might follow from his exercise of his academic and religious freedom. Thirdly, it would give the Protestant demonination a voice in the conduct of religious activities on the Brandeis campus. The University then would not meed to fear that semeone would accome them of trying to conduct a Protestant religious program free from responsible involvement with the Protestant Churches.
