More than 175 children live in Prospect Hill and over 80% of their families are led by single mothers. The Prospect Hill Community Center provides academic enrichment and professional development programs to the residents of Prospect Hill Terrace, and the surrounding Waltham community. The Community Center is supported by an innovative private-public partnership, including organizations such as Bentley University, Brandeis University, the Waltham Housing Authority, and the Waltham Police Department.

Since opening the Center in 2014, we have provided academic and professional development services to dozens of children and adults in the Waltham community. Our enrollment rates continue to increase as we strengthen our programming to meet the individual needs of our participants. Our programming is free, and we offer one-on-one tutoring by university students under the direction of our program directors. Our programs range from elementary and middle school tailored tutoring sessions, to Adult English Language Learners, and special programs throughout the year, such as the Fall Festival and the Spring Community Day for residents of the Prospect Hill Terrace community.
