Fall/Spring/Academic Year: All **need-based** and most **merit-based** Brandeis grants and scholarships are applicable for study abroad during the school year, not to exceed the cost of **Brandeis tuition**. Students may also use federal financial aid, including **Stafford Loans and Pell Grants**, to pay for study abroad.

<u>CET</u>	At time of program application	Students can apply for a scholarship from CET as part of their program application. CET also matches Brandeis' Helen Ke Scholarship for study in China and Gerzon Scholarship for study in Eastern Europe.	\$500 to \$1,500
<u>CIEE</u>	Varies/Rolling	CIEE scholarship and grant recipients are selected based on the quality of materials submitted for both need-based and merit-based awards. Students can access the application within their CIEE account. Students applying for the Gilman scholarship will qualify for the CIEE Gilman Go Grant.	Up to \$4,000
<u>IES</u>	Varies by scholarship type/ Rolling	Offers scholarships for students whose parent went abroad with IES, students with a disability, students from diverse backgrounds, merit-based scholarships, and need-based aid, as well as specific donor-funded scholarships. You can submit your scholarship application anytime, even before you submit your program application.	Typically up to \$2,000
IFSA	March (Summer) April (Fall) November (Spring)	Any student who applies for an IFSA program may apply for a scholarship by completing a scholarship application. This is separate from the general IFSA program application. Also special scholarships for First Generation students.	\$1,500 to \$3,500
<u>SIT</u>	March (Summer) May (Fall) November (Spring)	Must be on a SIT approved program. Varies by scholarship type. SIT matches Federal Pell Grant funding for all SIT semesters and offers scholarships specific to Posse students.	\$500 to \$5,000
<u>SFS</u>	After acceptance into program.	The quality of the information provided by the student is critical to the proper assessment and subsequent award of any aid. Students should apply for aid as soon as possible and should submit the application along with their program application.	Varies
