Fall course registration opened today on <u>SAGE</u> for incoming students and runs through the end of the day on Sunday, July 26. It reopens for all undergraduate students (including incoming students) on Monday, July 27 through the start of the semester.

All fall sections of University Writing Seminar (UWS) are now full. If you are not yet enrolled, plan to register for UWS when registration opens for the spring 2021 semester. This first year requirement can be taken either semester; half of the incoming class will take it in the fall, and half will take it in the spring.
