Bombshell: The Hedy Lamar Story

This film tells the story of Hedy Lamar, an American immigrant, whose arresting appearance and glamorous Hollywood life stood in the way of her being given the credit she deserved as an ingenious inventor. She developed a covert communication system to help defeat the Nazis, but was ignored and told to sell kisses for War Bonds instead. The disconnect between her brilliance and her beauty was only recognized toward the end of her life when tech pioneers discovered she was truly a technological trailblazer whose concepts impact all of us today.


