We will explore if today's antisemitism is unique to this time and if it is part of a larger problem in American society involving other ethno-racial groups. Finally, we will explore whether there is a connection between antisemitism and the asserted weakening of American Jewish influence. 23 TAXES 101 (NEW!)

Group will start meeting in December.

This class will meet December, January, and February and will be facilitated by Benny Alfano, an Enrolled Agent with the IRS. The first session will focus on IRS's Annual List of Scams and Schemes that affect taxpayers. We will learn how to spot these scams and schemes, how to avoid them, and where to report them. We will also learn about estimated tax payments and why you should strongly consider using them. The second session will focus on Estates, Trusts, Retirement Plans, Pensions, & Annuities. We will discuss what estates and trusts are and how they affect your and your beneficiaries' taxes. We will learn how Generation Skipping and transfer of taxes affect you and your family. In addition, we will learn about the different retirement plans, pensions, and annuities and how they can be beneficial to your tax planning and what happens to them upon your death. The last session will focus on the Federal Tax Changes and Updates for 2024 Income Taxes.
