

### **BUSAC REPRESENTATIVES ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES**

Last year's BUSAC elections brought 9 new BUSAC representatives to the roster to join incumbent representatives in service to Brandeis University staff. We named District B Representative Brittani Harris Niquette as Interim Chair.

As one of our District F representatives, John Thayer, and District J representative, Sue Scannell, moved into new job titles at Brandeis during the year, and At-Large representative Alexandra Brandon took on new responsibilities at Brandeis, Kurt Ferguson was appointed At-Large representative mid-year. Kurt has been communicating with District J constituents, which includes Campus Operations: Public Safety, Facilities, and Office of Conference and Event Services. Thank you to John, Sue, Alexandra and Kurt for your leadership during these changing times.

Among elected & appointed BUSAC Representatives, our roles in our districts include: Academic Administrator, Assistant Director, Associate Director (x2), Department Coordinator, Department Operations Administrator, Financial & Operational Administrative Assistant, Head Athletic Trainer/Coordinator of Student-Athlete Health and Wellness, Senior LMS Applications Administrator, Program Manager, Senior Assistant Director, Senior Associate Director, Senior Executive Administrator, Senior Program Administrator.

We meet once each month and pursue timely responses to inquiries, projects and activities that arise throughout the academic year. We are also in regular direct contact with VP of Human Resources, Robin Switzer, as well as EVP of Finance and Administration, Stewart Uretsky.

### **BUSAC REPRESENTATIVE COLLABORATION**

In Fall 2024, representatives informally reported at the BUSAC Monthly Meetings about the summertime series of department meetings with visits by various combinations of Brandeis Senior Leadership, including former President Ron Liebowitz, Provost Carol Fierke, EVP of Finance Stew Uretsky and VP of Human Resources Robin Switzer. Senior Leadership offered these meetings to departments to share perspectives and information.

In Spring 2025 BUSAC meetings, BUSAC representatives informally reported out and shared notes from the Provost's Offices' convenings of the four new school units.




### **BUSAC CONTACT FORM - STATS**

BUSAC Representatives received direct inquiries in-person and via email, and we brought our own questions and concerns to the group. We shared inquiries with Senior Leadership and appropriate departments to learn more – in some cases, dispelling rumors – and we shared our findings in meeting minutes, monthly BUSAC District newsletters, or were able to provide information and responses to constituents directly.

Questions, concerns and ideas from self-identified staff also came into our <u>Contact Form</u> from nearly every district. The BUSAC Contact Form fueled our conversations and task list and influenced our monthly meeting schedule and meeting guest roster the whole year.

### CAMPUS LEADERSHIP CONNECTIONS

#### **Meetings with Interim President Arthur Levine**

**November 12, 2024 -** In his early Brandeis University "Listening Tour", Interim President Arthur Levine met with BUSAC leadership Brittani Harris Niquette and Mara Tzizik-Swanson on November 12th to learn about BUSAC and describe his plan to meet with the Brandeis community throughout his 18-month interim term.

January 9, 2025 - BUSAC met in-person with Interim President Arthur Levine along with VP of Human Resources Robin Switzer. Interim President Levine asked BUSAC members why they stay at Brandeis. Responses included: the people, benefits, and mission of Brandeis.

May 7, 2025 - BUSAC held a hybrid in-person, virtual meeting with President Arthur Levine along with VP of Human Resources Robin Switzer where he asked BUSAC about their thoughts on qualities for the future incoming University President. Our survey sent to all staff was a direct result of this.

#### December 10, 2024

On December 10th, BUSAC hosted an Open Monthly Meeting, attended by more than 20 staff members in addition to BUSAC representatives.

On December 12th, BUSAC co-hosted the heavily attended Brandeis "Warm Winter Welcome" holiday celebration in the Levin Ballroom at Usdan with gratis catering by Harvest Table. #### **Presidential Qualities Survey**

BUSAC launched a brief, anonymous survey to find out what qualities Brandeis staff would like to see in a new Brandeis President. In an initial review of survey responses, staff would like the incoming Brandeis President to be active in the community and also have the desire to build relationships with faculty, staff, and students alike. Staff overwhelmingly want the incoming President to have the humility needed to listen to staff and value staff, along with being innovative and forward-looking to make necessary changes that will assist in creating both a positive academic and working environment. Our report will ultimately be shared with Interim President Levine.

In total, 304 votes were submitted, about 30% of eligible voters. As BUSAC has shared in recent monthly meeting reports, in light of ongoing Brandeis structural changes, we plan to review the BUSAC Charter and Districts in the coming year to align with the University's new school structure to maximize staff representation.
