Antonino Pittà is an Honorary Lecturer at University College London and a postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore (Milan). He holds a PhD in Latin Philology from the Scuola Normale Superiore di Pisa. His research activity is devoted to Roman Republican antiquarianism, late-antique lexicography, poetry of the Imperial Age, and the early reception of Augustan literature. He is deeply interested in textual criticism and manuscript traditions. As an editor of classical texts, he adopts a strictly philological approach and tends to combine the analysis of Latin language with the examination of historical *Realien*. Besides articles on Varro, Virgil, Lucan, Statius, and Epicurus, he published two critical editions with a commentary: Varro's *De vita populi Romani* (2015) and Statius' *Silvae* Book I: Domitian's poems (2021). He also took part to international workshops concerning the reception of Classical Antiquity in contemporary pop culture (*Game of Thrones*).
