
Christian Thrue Djurslev



Christian Thrue Djurslev currently works as an Assistant Professor of Classics in the Department of History and Classical Studies at Aarhus University, Denmark. In 2016, he completed his PhD in Classics and Ancient History from the University of Exeter, UK, after which he taught ancient Greek history at the University of Edinburgh, UK. He has published extensively on the reception of Alexander the Great from antiquity to today, but he is also interested in the reception of other ancient rulers, including Queen Tomyris of Scythia. His first book, *Alexander the Great in the Early Christian Tradition: Classical Reception and Patristic Literature* (2020, London), begins with a quote from Iron Maiden's anthem to the effect that Alexander paved the way for Christianity. However, it soon becomes clear that ancient Christians did not think that, but rather engaged with the monarch's legacy in many other intriguing ways.
