Jacqueline (Jackie) Jung is Professor and Director of Undergraduate Study in the Department of History of Art at Yale University. She specializes in the art and architecture of medieval Europe, with a focus on Gothic architecture and sculpture, but her undergraduate teaching has come to take a wider perspective, encompassing sacred buildings and allied arts in many living and historic religious traditions (including Greek and Roman antiquity). She has published two books—The Gothic Screen: Space, Sculpture, and Community in the Cathedrals of France and Germany (Cambridge University Press, 2013) and Eloquent Bodies: Movement, Expression, and the Human Figure in Gothic Sculpture (Yale University Press, 2020)—which have won some awards. In 1984 she convinced her Dad to take her and a friend to the American Rock Festival in Battle Creek, Michigan, which brought together the likes of Ratt, Quiet Riot, Motley Crue, and Ozzy.
