New fellows will join a thriving non-partisan network of faculty fellows across the United States who are teaching new courses or enhancing existing courses that engage students in hands-on study and work related to state-level legislation.

ENACT is based at Brandeis University in Massachusetts, and since 2016 has expanded to all 50 states. 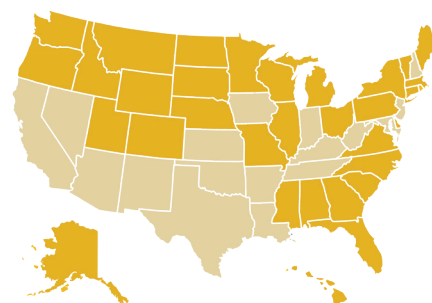


**F**ocusing on the policy process at the state level made a big difference. I had never done that before. It was a very big plus for my students. They learned a lot about
