 - Pursuing Agency Accreditation via Massachusetts Police Accreditation Commission






Department Details

At A Glance

- Led by Operations Lieutenant with 4 Sergeants who supervise up to 4 officers and dispatchers
- 19,000+ calls for service in 2021
- Criminal investigations, special events, parking and traffic enforcement, investigate crashes, search for missing persons, respond to life-threatening medical calls, etc.







Administration Division

Command Staff responsible for the day to day administrative tasks and functions of the department

Detectives Division

Consists of plainclothes detectives tasked with conducting a broad range of investigative assignments.

How can families receive alerts?

- Text "bensalerts" to 222767
 - This is an auto-enrollment
 - It is a free service; however your carrier may impose fees**

What kind of alerts are sent?

- Threats to life & property
- General warnings such as missing community members
- Severe weather (class cancelations)



Emergency Management Division

Students should be prepared for a variety of things...

- Severe Weather being the most likely to occur
 - Have an emergency kit:
 - Flashlights, external battery charger (for phones, tablets, etc.), prescriptions, a contact list, some snacks (nonperishable), seasonal clothing
- During emergencies or severe weather dining facilities may remain open, their hours and staffing may change based on the event
- Should be registered for BENS & possibly Waltham "CodeRed"



• The Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) course, designed and built on the Avoid, Deny Defend (ADD) strategy developed by ALERRT in 2004, provides strategies and guidance for surviving an active shooter event. Topics include the history and prevalence of active shooter events, civilian response options, and medical issues.

BUDPS has several instructors available including both sworn law enforcement officers and civilians

Parking Enforcement

The Office of Parking and Traffic is responsible for registering, monitoring and controlling all motor vehicles operated by the members of the Brandeis community and their guests.

- All students who operate or park a motor vehicle or motorcycle on the property of Brandeis University must obtain a parking permit before each academic school year.
- Parking is enforced Monday Friday 2am-5pm and 24/7 in the following lots Upper Science, Bernstein Marcus, Admissions and Athletic staff. From 5pm-2am parking is allowed throughout campus in legal parking spots excluding the 24/7 lots.
- All vehicles with 3 or more parking citations are eligible for tow at owner's expense, also any citation over 30 days unpaid will put a hold on student accounts.
- First year and sophomore are not eligible to have a vehicle on campus.



Parking Enforcement

New Initiatives

Electric Vehicles

Recognizing that electric vehicles emit fewer emissions than almost all comparable gasoline cars, Brandeis
has installed 10 electric vehicle charging stations at four parking lots on campus: Admissions, Athletics,
Theater, and Tower.

Bicycle Registration

Beginning in the fall of 2022, all bicycles must be registered through the parking office, this is free.

Automobile and Golf Cart Training

 The Office of Parking and Traffic regulates and provides safety training for anyone driving a universityowned, leased, or rented vehicle or golf cart.

Notary Services

Any student needing Notary services can email or call the parking office for assistance.
