Brandeis University 2026-2027 Need-Based Financial Aid Appeal Worksheet

Instructions

If your circumstances have changed since your initial application, or if you have more information you would like us to consider, you may request a review of your **need-based financial aid** package. Please note: Merit scholarship decisions are final and there is no reconsideration process. We cannot consider appeals based on credit card debt, car or mortgage payments, wedding/celebration expenses, private school costs, or other discretionary expenses.

If you have not already submitted a 2026-2027 FAFSA (if applicable), 2026-2027 CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE, complete copies of the student's and parents' 2024 Federal Tax Returns,* you must do so before filing an appeal.

To ensure consideration for the academic year starting in August, Early Decision students must submit appeals by March 1, Early Action students by April 1, and Regular Decision students by April 15. There is no specific deadline for returning students, but **appeals from continuing students will not be addressed until after July 15th, 2026**.

Once the Appeals Committee reviews the submitted documentation and determines if the student qualifies for additional aid, we will notify the student by email. Response time will vary based on our volume of appeals at the time you submit your request, but we strive to respond within 10 business days. Additional grant funds will only be offered if a student has taken advantage of all other sources of financial aid (e.g., federal and state grants, subsidized and unsubsidized federal loans, etc.).

Submission of an appeal does not grant an extension of the bill due date. All student accounts must be paid in full by the stated due dates even if an appeal is in process.
