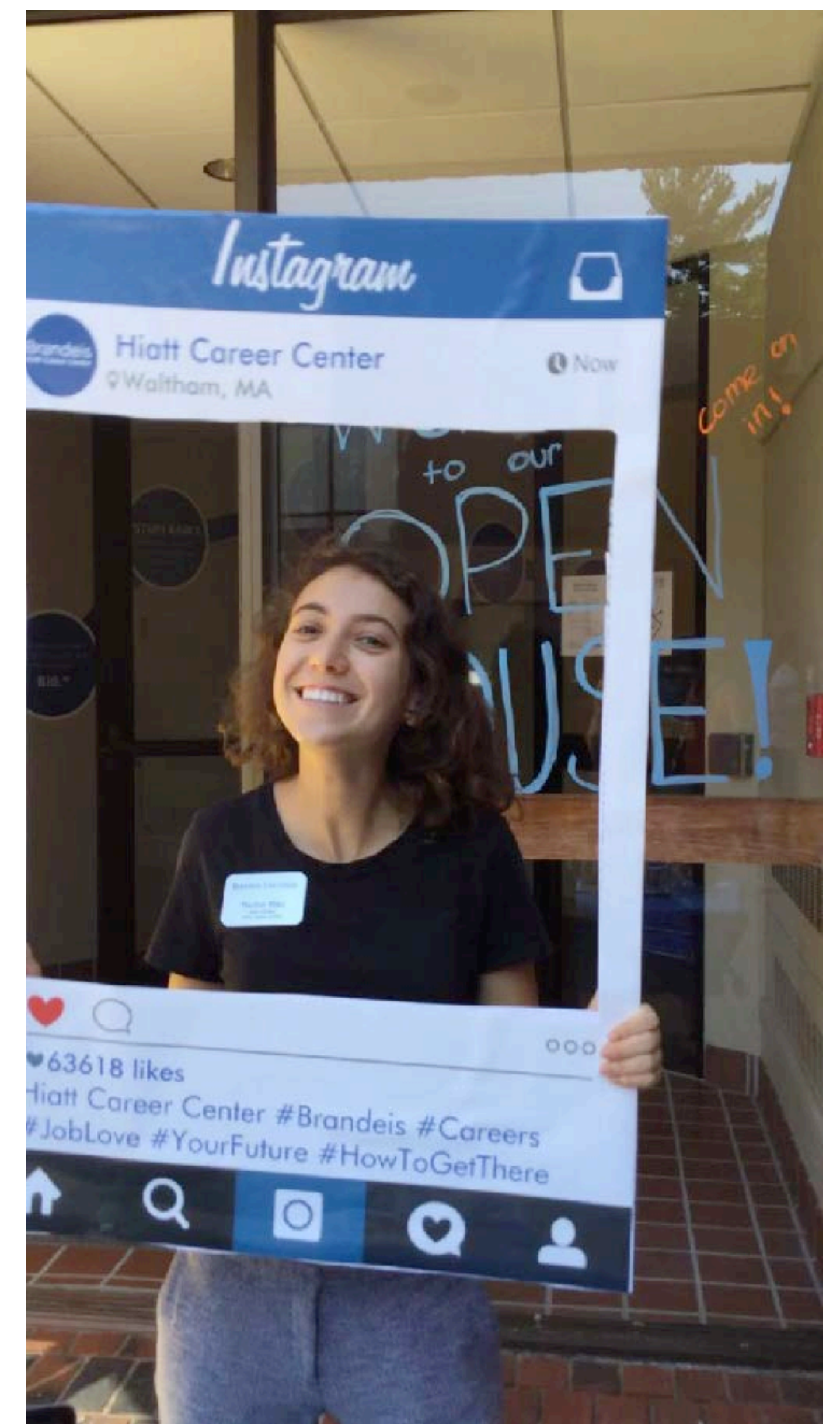
Chaos Theory of Careers

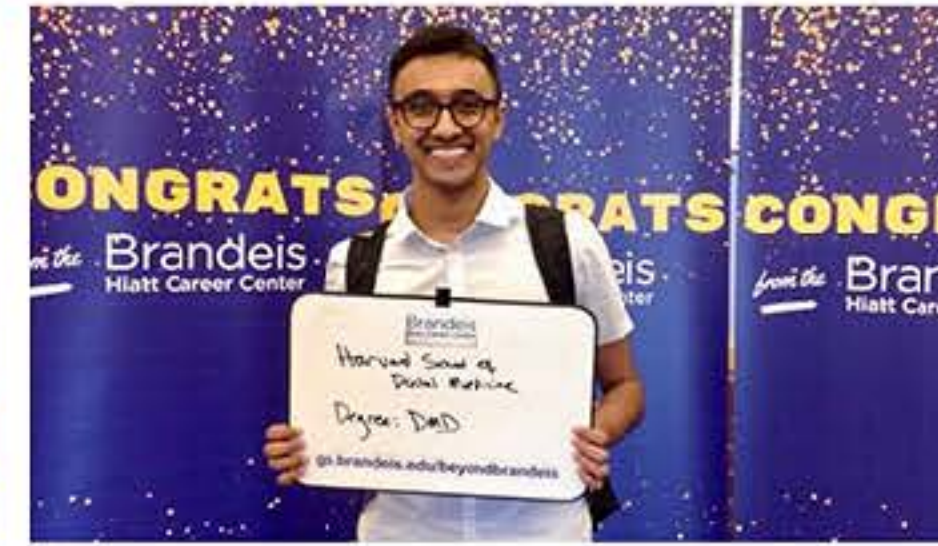

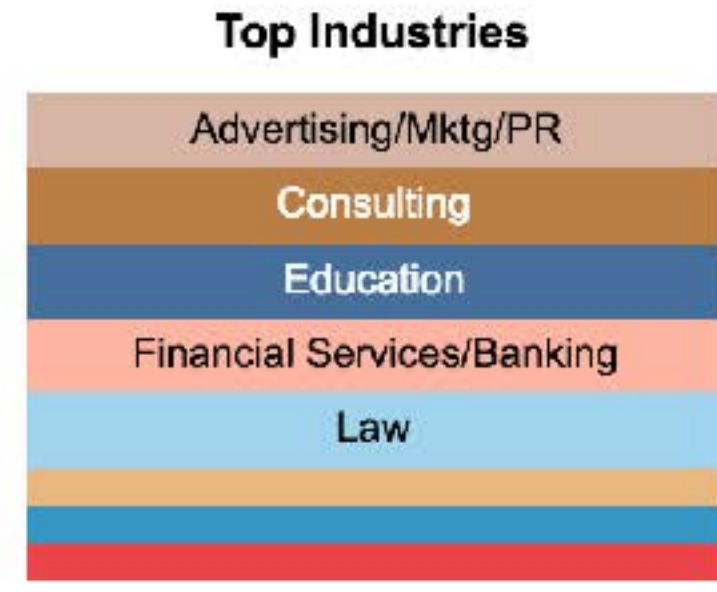

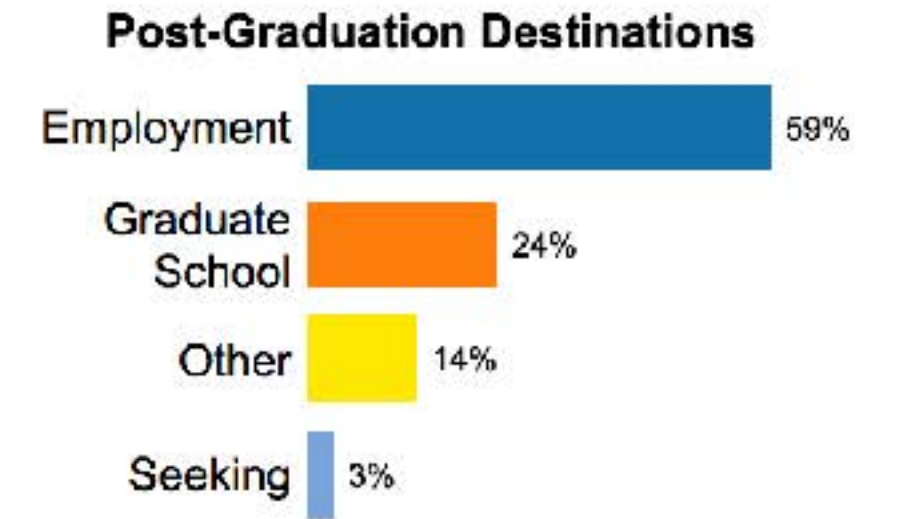
